


England's ancient capital


Winchester is a city renowned for having a deep and expansive history and a treasure trove of English heritage. From Iron Age forts to Civil War sites, a world-famous cathedral to a working mill on the river, the district offers a wealth of intrigue for visitors looking to uncover Britain's past. Explore some of our must-see historic gems and bear witness to the history of Britain.


Throughout history, a wealth of now-legendary historic figures have lived in or made an impact on Winchester, and **King Alfred the Great** (c849–899) is no exception. Scholar, soldier, statesman, King Alfred rebuilt Winchester after the Dark Ages making it his capital, and today you can see his statue – designed by Hamo Thornycroft – dominating the Broadway.



Begin your visit with a bird's eye view of the city from St Giles Hill. Trace the sweep of the Medieval and Georgian buildings, laid out according to the original Saxon street plan.

Follow in the footsteps of John Keats, who penned his ode 'To Autumn' after an inspiring walk. Take his route along the water meadows and you will come across the **Hospital of St Cross**. With beautiful architecture in a tranquil setting, the Hospital is one of England's oldest continuing almshouses.

Further out of the city you will find **Fort Nelson**. Take a tour here to discover the vast collection of artillery and guns and wander through the tunnels (a great place to escape to on a hot day).

Ever fancied a ride on a stream train? Head down to the **Mid Hants** Railway – Watercress line.

TOP TIP

Grab your walking boots and take a tour through history with one of many self guided tours available on the Visit Winchester website or at the Winchester Tourist Information Centre. Tours include a Royal Blood trail, Medieval Jewish trail and the City Walk – three trails around the city centre. For more trails across the district see page 14.













HIDDEN GEMS




WHAT WILL YOU DISCOVER?









Winchester Cathedral is one of Europe's finest medieval Cathedrals. Step inside to explore the beauty of this ancient building and discover over 1,000 years of history.

Marvel at the longest medieval Nave in Europe, admire stunning architecture and be captivated by the fascinating stories of the people who have shaped the Cathedral's history over the centuries.

Once the seat of Anglo-Saxon and Norman power, Winchester Cathedral is the resting place of Saxon royalty, bishops and Jane Austen, the much-loved English novelist You'll find priceless treasures and great works of art, from sculpture by Antony Gormley to the magnificent 12th-century Winchester Bible.


To complete your visit, indulge in delicious food and drink in the Refectory or browse the Gift Shop for bespoke gifts and souvenirs.

Believed to be the oldest continuously running school in the country...

Founded in 1382 by William of Wykeham, Bishop of Winchester 1366–1404, Winchester College is believed to be the oldest continuously running school in the country. Our guided tours concentrate on the medieval heart of the College and include Chamber Court, which takes its name from the Scholars' and Fellows' chambers enclosing it; the 14th century Gothic Chapel with one of the earliest examples of a wooden vaulted roof; College Hall, the original Scholars' dining room; School, the 17th century redbrick schoolroom and the original medieval cloister.

Today the College educates around 700 boys aged 13 to 18, with the 70 scholars still housed in these medieval buildings

Admission to the College is by guided tour only; these are available all year except between Christmas and New Year.

Visit this traditional working watermill that has stood at the heart of the historic city of Winchester for over 1000 years. Now fully restored by the National Trust, the City Mill is probably the oldest working watermill in the UK.


The City Mill is also the gateway to the South Downs National Park and features the official start point of the South Downs Way National Trail.


The South Downs gateway features a wide selection of information for those wishing to explore local walks and the attractions found within the South Downs, including the many historic National Trust properties.
















Visitors can admire the medieval architecture, absorb the quiet calm in the fine transitional Norman church, explore the beautiful flower gardens and receive the Wayfarer's Dole, which is a small cup of beer and a morsel of bread. The gift shop opens throughout the year, selling a selection of high quality goods from the Porter's Lodge. Tea rooms in the Hundred Men's Hall provide refreshments during the summer. St Cross is an easy walk along the river, 20 minutes from the City centre.


The **Treasury Museum** at **Winchester College** will host a Keats exhibition from 10 September until the end of December. The exhibition will explore Keats' time in Winchester and also the culture of Winchester in the 19th century.

On Thursday 19 September, the college will also host a talk by Professor Jonathan Bate, a well-known scholar on the Romantic Age.

The University of Winchester will be running a showcase event on 7 October at **Theatre Royal Winchester** based on 200 Years of *To Autumn* and is working with the Hampshire Writers' Society, Blue Apple Theatre, Winchester Writers' Festival as well as Creative Writing and Performing Arts students to present creative responses about *To Autumn*.

Heritage Open Days in September will be running more related events offering you the chance to see hidden places.

One of the Brothers at the **Hospital of St Cross** is putting together an exhibition which will run from mid August



2TimeTheatre will be producing 'A Fruitful Season: Keats in Winchester' as part of the Winchester Festival in St Lawrence Church on the 6 and 7 July at 3pm.

48 hours in Winchester

DAY ONE

Start your trip by getting acquainted with the city. Take a guided tour with one of Winchester's official accredited tour guides starting at the tourist information centre and discover the hidden gems of the city.

As you stroll through the compact city centre, you'll discover an array of fabulous independent shops, bustling market stalls and award-winning eateries that suit every appetite.

Stop off at the **City Museum** with its interactive children's activities and the impressive Winchester Model, a scale model of the city in Victorian times. As you exit, an avenue of lime trees heralds your approach to the **Cathedral**. Must-sees include the glorious carved wooden quire and a jaw-dropping view from the tower.

Walk down College Street to **Winchester College** – past Jane Austen's final residence (now a private residence) – for a fascinating tour of the history of its alumni and the buildings.

If you still have the energy, head to the **Great Hall** to see the legendary Arthurian **Round Table**; the atmospheric **Westgate Museum** with its Tudor ceiling is just a few steps away (open April to October), as are five splendid **Military Museums** housed at Peninsula Barracks.

In the evening, enjoy a relaxing dinner at one of a diverse range of dining options, from great pub grub to haute cuisine, see page 24.









TOP TIP

Prefer to amble at your own pace? Grab a free self-guided walk from the award-winning tourist information centre, situated in the Guildhall under the watchful eye of King Alfred's statue.

DAY TWO

Make a visit to Jane Austen's House Museum and Chawton House at Chawton before heading into the pretty market town of Alresford.

From Alton station, enjoy the magic of steam travel from a bygone age on the **Mid Hants Railway – Watercress Line** as you cut through the rolling downs on the line that established Alresford as the UK's watercress capital. Look out for temporary service changes to services between Alton and Medstead from January to July 2019 while work is carried out on Whitedown Lane bridge. See **watercressline.co.uk** for updates.

Alresford is perhaps the prettiest Georgian market town in England, with a circular river walk, quirky cafes, pastel-painted buildings and boutiques – it's a great spot to wind down for a day.

Stop off at the UK's largest planetarium at the **Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium** on the way back to the city.



Alternatively or if you are staying longer, start your day with a trip to **Marwell Zoo** with its exciting lemur walkthrough, see the giraffes and penguins and visit the amazing Tropical House, built out of the same materials as the Eden project and providing a better habitat for the animals. Enjoy uninterrupted close-up views whilst learning about the flow of energy through life.





Bishop's Waltham and **Wickham**, two Medieval market towns, are just a stone's throw from here – English Heritage's **Bishop's Waltham Palace** has an intriguing museum in the grounds.

After your adventures in rural Hampshire, head back to the city centre and round off the day with a trip to see a show at the **Theatre Royal Winchester** – Wintonians will tell you that this building is haunted...



Winchester is but sting with a huge variety of fun family attractions offering loads to see and do – perfect for children...and the young at heart.

DAY ONE

Meerkats, milling and museums

Start your day visiting some of Winchester's cutest and fluffiest residents at **Marwell Zoo**. Dive into the underwater world of the penguins before taking a prowl around big cat country. Take the train to explore the world of fur, feathers and scales before exploring the African wilderness in Wild Explorers.

Venture into the city centre to see Winchester's resident otters at the **Winchester City Mill**. See their activity on CCTV whilst milling your own flour in the oldest working watermill in the country. If history is more your style, journey back in time with fun children's activities at the **Winchester City Museum**, the **Westgate Museum** and the **Great Hall**.

DAY TWO

Steam, science and a show

Venture out of the centre to the market town of Alresford, home to the **Mid Hants Railway – Watercress Line**. Climb aboard a restored steam train and ride the rails between Alton and Alresford taking in the sights, sounds, smells and magic of steam travel from a bygone age.

Journey back into the city centre and travel from the past to the future with a visit to the **Winchester Science Centre and Planetarium**. Ever wanted to know what happens to your food after you swallow it? Want to know who can run the fastest and jump the highest in your group? Or just want your mind blown with the warped perceptions of the LittleBigRoom? Discover it all under one roof!

If you can squeeze in a visit to the **Winchester Discovery Centre** or **Theatre Royal Winchester** for a family friendly show you will not leave disappointed. Laugh along with some well know stories and venture into a world of imagination. Make sure you book early for this year's panto – Dick Whittington.

No visit would be complete without visiting some of Winchester's family-friendly eating establishments with a great range of flavours and tastes to choose from – even the fussiest eater will be satisfied.







Round Table Maze



Wasabi from farm to plate



The River Itchen, which runs through the heart of the Winchester District, and the River Test to the south west are famous for the wild brown trout and rainbow trout which thrive in their 'gin clear' fast flowing waters. You can sample this delicious fish in numerous pubs and restaurants in the area. Winchester is full of amazing local produce from aromatic gin, world-renowned watercress to remarkable fresh water trout – however, not many people know Winchester also produces incredible wasabi...

This unique plant is grown within the Winchester District by The Wasabi Company, host of the only farms outside of Japan that grow wasabi in gravel beds with fresh flowing water from natural springs. The wasabi plant grows in a similar environment to that of the famous watercress, which is why Winchester has the perfect growing conditions. The wasabi that is grown here is used across the world from Europe to Singapore and Dubai.

The only way to experience the true taste of wasabi is to have it fresh. Once grated the taste profile changes and it will only hold its pungency for about 15 minutes. In Winchester you can try fresh wasabi in **Kyoto Kitchen** who use the plant in a variety of delicious ways. A favourite is the Winchester Roll, a sushi dish which not only encompasses different parts of the wasabi plant but also features local trout. Be sure to stop off in Parchment Street to have a try.

THE CHESIL RECTORY UNVEILS

BEAUTIFUL COURTYARD GARDEN

One of Hampshire's most historic independent restaurants, **The Chesil Rectory**, has created a romantic garden in time for its 10th anniversary. Unveiled to customers at the end of August 2018, the garden comes as owner Mark Dodd continues to evolve and grow the family-run business.

Its Medieval building, now the oldest commercial property in the Winchester area, is what makes **The Chesil Rectory** unique. Occupying a 600-year-old Grade II listed Medieval house, the restaurant has always been full of exceptional character, and the stylish adjoining garden complements this famous ambience, giving the historical building a beautiful outside space ten years on from the original design.

With seating for over 40 covers, the garden features a central circular seat surrounding the famous Elder tree; a herb planting wall, ivy clad statues, an abundance of flowers and trees alongside vintage urns and even a garden swing where guests can enjoy a pre-dinner sundowner.

A special terrace menu has been created by Head Chef and stakeholder Damian Brown featuring a range dishes using local produce.

Bombay Sapphire The LaverStoke

Sam Carter's winter-inspired Laverstoke cocktail

INGREDIENTS

50ml Bombay Sapphire

- 3. Turn off the heat, turn the breast over to take residual heat and set aside to rest for a few minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, combine crumbled Feta, chives, broad beans, vinaigrette in a large bowl.
- 5. Add salt and pepper to taste.
- 6. Toast the slices of ciabatta.

Mayflower 400

On August 15th 1620 the Mayflower and Speedwell sailed away from Southampton bound for the New World, with 102 Pilgrims on board. That journey was a key event in the founding of America, and what has happened since has changed the world.

Winchester has a direct connection to the Mayflower, as local boy Stephen Hopkins was on board. Hopkins was baptised 30 April 1581 at Upper Clatford. Not much is known about his early life in Hampshire, but his family appears to have removed to Winchester by 1586 and by 1604 he had moved to Hursley.

To commemorate the voyage, we are planning a year-long programme of events running from November 2019 to November 2020.

The Mayflower 400 programme gives us a unique opportunity to highlight Hampshire's cultural, maritime and heritage assets to members of our community as well as visitors from across the UK, the Netherlands and the USA.

In addition to the headline events in Southampton described below we will work with local event organisers and attractions including Hat Fair, the Poetry Festival, the Cathedral and the College to deliver exciting events across Winchester. Festival of Light

The Festival of Light will open the Mayflower 400 commemorations in style in November 2019.

We'll be running a high-profile light inspired event held in partnership with over 20 national and international partner locations. The Festival of Light will also be the grand finale for the commemoration in November 2020, providing an opportunity to celebrate our achievements over the year and set the foundations for Mayflower 400's legacy.



The Fourney

Building on its track record for shining a spotlight on important local stories (THE SHADOW FACTORY, SS MENDI), Nuffield Southampton Theatres will develop and create a city-wide production in August 2020, THE JOURNEY, which incorporates mass community participation into a unique story about Southampton's extraordinary history of journeys. The production will travel across the city, weaving in and out of its spaces and architecture, moving from land to sea, celebrating the diversity of its people as it goes.



The ABP Mayflower Marathon

The Marathon route is an exciting mix of coast, city and parks. The route is predominantly flat, perfect for a debut marathon! There are many delights on the route including crossing the Itchen Bridge, alongside the beautiful mouth of the Solent, before running through St. Mary's Stadium, through the huge expanse of the Common, and finishing in Mayflower Park. At the top of the bridge almost 100ft up, you'll experience a feast for the eyes with the beautiful view of the city, the River Itchen, commercial centre and out to sea towards the Isle of Wight. Mayflower Musicals

Mayflower Theatre is commissioning and producing four new musicals as part of the Mayflower 400 commemorations. The brief for the musicals has been developed working with young people responding to the themes of Mayflower 400. Those composers selected to write the pieces will be given support to develop the work over the coming year. The final works will be performed at the theatre by youth and amateur groups working with professional creative teams in August 2020. 
South Downs food

Winchester City Mill Gateway to the South Downs National Park






Alresford

DID YOU KNOW?

According to John Arlott, the cricket broadcaster and commentator who lived in Alresford between 1961 and 1981, Alresford Cricket Club was one of the strongest teams in England between 1770 and 1795. As England hosts the ICC Cricket World Cup in 2019, there's no better time to find out more about Alresford's excellent cricketing reputation than following our Cricket Trail which will guide you as you trace its evolution across Winchester and Hampshire's countryside. If you're lucky enough to get tickets to a match at the Ageas Bowl, Winchester is only half an hour by car.

The town's history is punctuated with fires, despite the abundance of water in the area, and the buildings that you see today rose from the ashes of the great

fires of the 17th century.









Sixteen miles from Winchester city centre and just four miles from Bishop's Waltham is the picturesque village of Wickham.





A Winchester Life

Keiran Phelan, Literary Detective

A founding trustee of Winchester Poetry Festival, one of the many celebratory festivals held throughout the year, Keiren considers some of the city's literary heroes in the year commemorating the 200th anniversary of John Keats' visit.

During August and September 1819 the great romantic poet John Keats spent two months in Winchester, which he described in a letter to his sister as 'the pleasantest town I ever was in'. I've lived and worked in Winchester for almost forty years and I know just how he feels. Keats' day invariably featured an exploratory walk while mine generally begins with a trawl through the inbox. Today my eye is caught by a note from Wendy Cope with a query about a poetry competition for young people. She loved living in Winchester and the house in Kingsgate Street she shared with her husband Lachlan Mackinnon is one of the twelve Sites of Special Poetic Interest on my occasional literary tours around the city centre. The team at the bi-annual Winchester Poetry Festival is always looking to provide free events and this walk is one of them.

The trustees keep the pot on the boil during the in-between year with other events and activities. The 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's death was celebrated in 2016 with an all-day reading by 154 individuals of every one of his sonnets.



Keats' riverside walks inspired his wonderful ode 'To Autumn', one of the nation's favourite and most anthologised poems. Follow a self-guided leaflet for this walk available from the tourist information centre or online at visitwinchester.co.uk

I'm obsessed by the

John Keats stopped off in Winchester in search of a library. He was enchanted by the city: the buildings, the trees, streams, streets, the cathedral and college, though he was irritated by the fiddle practice of his landlady's son. I'm obsessed by the question of where he lodged. He wrote fifteen of his glorious letters from Winchester and doesn't give his address in any of them. It was probably in Colebrook Street, between the Guildhall and the Mercure Hotel, in tenements which were demolished in the 1955/56 clearances.

Thinking of College Street and the cathedral coincides with news about Jane Austen, the city's other great literary hero. I hear from Jane Austen House Museum in Chawton, where I'm also a trustee, that writer/comedian/director David Baddiel is to be the museum's ambassador for 2019 to help celebrate its 70th year. He describes Austen as 'one of the greatest geniuses in English Literature, the mother of the modern novel.'

My main aim for the year is to get back to work on the Literary Winchester website, an anthology of 1000 years of writing which is either inspired by or features Winchester and includes about seventy names.

However, it's back to the nineteenth century for my current reading. I like to tackle one major classic every year, and this time it's Victor Hugo's extraordinary, and very lengthy, *Les Misérables*, or *The Wretched* as it is in the English translation I'm enjoying.








In a hot frying pan, fry the salmon fillets skin-side down in a little olive oil until the skin is crispy and golden, then flip to finish cooking. Serve the fish on top of crushed new potatoes dressed with herb butter and steamed green beans. Dress the dish with the watercress sauce.
